## Message from the Principal...

It is the season to be **thankful**, and as I think about what I am personally thankful for, my mind goes to a recent event at school. As I am sure you all are aware, on the morning of October 11th shortly after school started for the day, we initiated a lockdown at CHS. The lockdown was based on what we believed to be a credible threat toward our school, that was posted on social media. Why you might ask would I be writing about being **thankful** in this situation? Here is why. When this situation occurred, we immediately went into our process of locking down the building and calling the authorities. As the morning progressed I was amazed and oh so thankful that everyone involved in securing our building; teachers, office personnel, custodians, and administration, all acted in such a remarkably professional and expedited manner that the building was quickly locked up and students were secured in their classrooms.

This situation is never easy, there are immediately questions from students and the anxiety level in the building is at a heightened state. I am ever so **thankful** that, to their credit, our students reacted to the situation just as you would want and hope. They followed directions, did not panic, and maintained the level of decorum that we needed given the situation. Next, I was very **thankful** at the response time from our police department. Our SRO was not in building at the time, as it is a part time position, but the officers on duty that day in Duvall responded quickly, appropriately and in a manner that immediately heightened our level of comfort, in an uncomfortable situation. We should all be **thankful** to have such a responsive, helpful and "user friendly" police department. Finally, I must report that it was a student who brought the concern to my office with a teacher at the beginning of the day. This is a difficult act for a student, to bring

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information to authorities about the actions of a classmate. But, in situations of violence at schools, it seems we always find out that someone, somewhere, had information that could have helped resolve a situation without incident. I am probably most **thankful** that we had a student that stood up to what was right and brought forth the information.

As you can imagine, with the wonders of social media (which was a part of the problem in the first place) many students texted out from the building to parents and friends. While this type of communication may not really be helpful to the situation, it is the world we live in. That said, our phones were ringing off the hook, and understandably so. Parents were calling to see what was going on and if they could or should come to school and pick up their student. The problem is at the time it is difficult for us to field these calls and we are probably not going to be able to respond with much detail at the time. Please know this, ***your students and their safety is our number one priority at a time like this.*** Information will come forward from the school or school district office as soon as safely possible. Also, in a situation such as this, the last thing anyone needs are more people coming to the campus. This is not safe for anyone, as we are forced to go out of a locked down building to check the vehicle, or alternatively, the person arriving would have to walk up to the building without knowing if it is safe. So please, if we have a situation in the future, resist the urge to come on campus. And, if you call and the phone isn't answered or the response from office personnel is short, understand that it is because we are doing everything in our power to control the situation for the safety of all.

I was most **thankful** that this event turned out without incident, and that in effect, it was a great learning experience for all of us! Let's all have a great Thanksgiving Holiday!

## Career and Technical Education

Several Career and Technical Education students from Seth Thomas and Mike Miyoshi's Agriculture and Computer Programming classes participated in a field trip to the Magnuson Park Construction Careers Day this past October 6th. Many King County businesses were represented having set up booths and activities for local high school students to learn about post-secondary options in the trades.

Additionally, the students had access to numerous hands on stations which even included heavy equipment operations. The kids were able to drive a Bobcat, operate a crane, a backhoe, and several lifts. Other stations involved building a small shed, screeding concrete, making plaster molds, driving a robot, and even tying down rebar. The students learned of the newest innovations in computerized construction design called BIMM—Building Information Modeling and Management. Using these newest digital tools, the construction/architecture team can virtually model all the building systems, troubleshoot infrastructure issues, and visualize integrated components long before the actual construction.



Our assigned guide for the day was a recent graduate of UW's Construction Management 4 year program. After his graduation and internship, he landed a high paying job in South Lake Union where he is in charge of building high rises. The students discovered there are so many trades that are scrambling for workers to train as an apprentice. The current workforce is aging out leaving an enormous skills gap. Unfortunately, very few young people are encouraged to go into these available apprenticeships.

Apprenticing is the ultimate 4-year degree. Unlike college students, a student of the trades is paid from the minute they walk through the door of their chosen program. They start with two years of earning \$20-\$30/hour with regular raises along the way.

After the initial 2000+ training hours, those that become journeyman, go on to earn well over \$35-\$60 per hour with a hefty benefits package on top. While speaking with Seattle City Light, they indicated that students do need to earn a high school diploma, have preparation from core math classes such as Geometry, as well as have an understanding of how to communicate and cooperate as a team.

The entire Construction Trades event was extremely well done and so very inspiring to these young people. Cedarcrest Career and Technical Education courses and their student leadership organizations are one way to prepare for these types of in high paying high demand professions.

## Nurse's Notes

### Vaccinations

New this year - all high students are required by the state to provide the date of the Chicken pox (Varicella) vaccinations- 2 doses, proof of illness, or a signed vaccination exemption to the school. Thank you to all of you who have already



turned in records, since health care providers do not share this information with us. If you have not yet received required vaccinations, please schedule an appointment with your health care provider. We will send an email next week if your child does not have the required doses on file with us.

## WHEN TO KEEP YOUR CHILD HOME OR WHEN YOUR CHILD MIGHT BE SENT HOME

- Students with a fever of 100 degrees F or higher should stay home for at least 24 hours and not attend school until fever-free, for 24 hours, without fever-reducing medications.
- Students with a cough or sore throat, especially with a fever, should stay home from school until at least 24 hours after flu-like symptoms have resolved
- Vomiting or diarrhea, until symptom free for 24 hours
- Pink eye, with or without drainage, until treated
- Lice, nits (lice eggs), or scabies until treated and nit/lice free
- Body rash

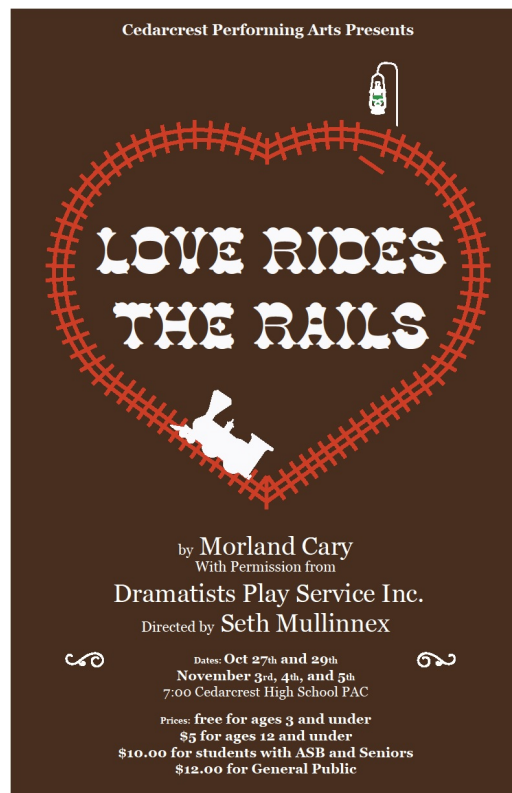

- Locate the "PARENT/STUDENT/MEMBERS LOGIN" section of the web page.
- Login to your child's program account using 'cedarcrestmusic':
- When you enter your student's 7-digit ID NUMBER as a Student Area Password, another more detailed screen appears with even more options to view your student's uniform assignments, music assignments, financial records, forms and inventory. Once you have first entered this ID number, you may create your own, unique password by clicking on the "keyhole" (Change Password) button.

**Weapons**

State Law (RCW 28A-600.420 and School District Policy 3200 prohibit the possession of firearms and weapons at school. This law pertains to guns, knives, clubs, firecrackers, and explosives. Dangerous weapons also include toy or "dummy" or look-alike objects. The full text of the law and the definitions of dangerous weapons, as provided RCW9.41.250 and RCW 9.41.280, are on file in the school office. Possession of firearms on school property will result in a one year mandatory expulsion, subject to appeal with notification to parents and law enforcement. Any violations of these guidelines by students constitutes grounds for expulsion from the Riverview School District and the public schools of the State of Washington, in accordance with the due process provisions of Washington State Law and Board Policy
