Smarter Balance - Math April 25, 26, 27

The Smarter Balance assessment will be administered to all 10th grade students and those 11th and 12th grade students who have not yet passed the assessment. It is vital that students needing to take the exam are not absent during the testing window.

On testing days, Cedarcrest High School will be on a modified schedule to allow students who are being assessed the best environment to maximize their focus and effort. **Testing students must report to school at 7:20 am. Buses will run at the normal times. Those students who are not testing should report no earlier than 9:45 am. Classes will start at 10:00 am.** *Students who need to ride the bus to school will be scheduled with teachers in individual study halls between 7:20 am and 9:45 am. Those who are able to find their own rides to school may report between 9:45 and 10:00 am.*

HIV/AIDS Education

The AIDS Omnibus Bill, enacted by the legislature, requires that all AIDS curriculum materials used in the district be state approved. School districts must also provide AIDS education "to all students grades five through twelve once during each school year." Riverview School District is using the state approved KNOW AIDS and F.L.A.S.H. programs, developed by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction and a team of school district, university and Department of Social and Health Services personnel.

At CHS we will be asking students to view a video presentation that deals with HIV and AIDS. The presentation will discuss the facts related to all aspects of contracting and treating HIV as well as current statistics. The presentation will be on Wednesday, May 10th during advisory. CEDARCREST LANDSCAPE TEAM WINS STATE!!!

Cedarcrest FFA Landscape team won the state competition on March 24th, 2017. The FFA nursery and landscape competition sounds simple. Look at some plants, name them and then design a landscape. But it's a much more difficult process. "We have to identify about 120 to 130 plants," Ben Benson said. "And what's so tough about it is they might get a twig of a plant, a part of the leaf or piece of bark. I know what a bald cypress looks like, I can identify it, but if you just give me a piece of bark, I don't think I could. That's what we do in this competition." The contest is composed of 5 individual events and 1 team event: a general knowledge exam, identification of 116 plant species, landscape estimating, a written assistance exercise, and a nursery production exercise. The team activity involved a landscape drawing and presentation of the drawing to a panel. The written exercise included a hand-written business letter. The overall contest is quite extensive, pulling skills from mathematics in landscape estimation, English in written assistance, and biology in the general knowledge exam.

It's a tremendous accomplishment to win a state FFA contest. The team spent several hours preparing and training for the contest with practices, study, and hard work; they definitely earned the title of state champs. With over 9,000 FFA members in WA, there are plenty of people who go 'all out' to win. Team members include: Kendra Mutch (Top individual score in the State), Ben Benson (2nd individual in the state), Zakya Misallati, Nicole Ballard, and Brittney Trujillo. This year's team under the guidance of Mr. Seth Thomas went to work. "They worked so hard for this," Thomas said. "I'm so proud of them". The championship earns the team an invitation to the 2016 National FFA Convention in October 2017 in Indianapolis.
