Finally, this month I want to review our process for parents to voice any concerns they may have with a class or staff member.

#### Step I

Contact the teacher if it is a situation regarding the instruction of a student.

#### Step II

Contact your student's counselor for their help if not resolved at the teacher level.

#### Step III

Contact the building principal with concerns/questions that have not been resolved at the teacher level. If questions and concerns are general in nature, it is appropriate to contact the principal directly.

#### Step IV

If concerns/questions are not addressed adequately at the building level, the Superintendent or designee is the next contact source

#### Step V

Concerns of a general nature that have not been adequately addressed by the Superintendent's office, may be directed to the Board of Directors in writing, through the Superintendent's office. Questions and/or concerns about these guidelines, can be directed to the Superintendent's office at 425-844-4504.

**Refund Policy for Student Fees:** Refunds for class fees must be requested by mid-term of the semester in which the class was originally scheduled. After mid-term, no refunds will be issued. Sports participation fee refunds must be requested within the sport season that was paid for. ## Counseling Center

### Smarter Balance - Language Arts March 28, 29, and 30

The Smarter Balance-Language Arts assessment will be administered to all 10th grade students and those 11th and 12th grade students who have not yet passed the assessment. It is vital that students needing to take the exam are not absent during the testing window.

On testing days, Cedarcrest High School will be on a modified schedule to allow students who are being assessed the best environment to maximize their focus and effort. **Testing students must report to school at 7:20 am. Buses will run at the normal times. Those students who are not testing will report at 9:45 am. Classes will start at 10:00 am.** *Students who need to ride the bus to school will be scheduled with teachers in individual study halls between 7:20 am and 9:45 am. Those who are able to find their own rides to school may report between 9:45 and 10:00 am.*

Please remind your students that they are not allowed to leave the campus should we transport them via district vehicle to school. Once they are on campus, they must remain on campus. Students who are not testing will be able to work with their teachers on assignments and seek help from teachers who are not proctoring the Smarter Balance Assessment.

**\*NOTE:** Please remind your student that no personal electronic equipment (cell phone, iPad, mp3 etc...) will be allowed during the entire testing period (7:20 am-9:45 am). Use of electronic devices during the testing window may result in the invalidation of his/her test.

For second time, Cedarcrest High School's FFA hosted the Sno-Valley Tilth's annual seed exchange. Students ran a few booth's including one in which they sold bulb pots that included tulips and daffodils. The booth also sold metal roses the students in shop classes made. ### DECA NEWS

The results are in for this year's State DECA competition (SCDC). With more than 3500 students competing across 30 events that have 70 or more competitors in each, Cedarcrest DECA finished with 29 awesome kids at the event and the follow highlights:

- 21 TOP 20 finishes
- 14 TOP 10 finishes
- 6 TOP 5 finishes
- 1 State Champion
- 19 students recognized on stage :)

We had a group win the Virtual Business Marketing competition held in the fall that is not recognized at the State competition.

Our chapter is proud to announce that we received recognition for our membership growth and chapter/community involvement. Less than 2% of all chapters nationwide received these awards and for our efforts have the ability to send some members to leadership academies at the international conference.

With all of this success, CHS DECA can send up to 19 members to the International competition (ICDC) in Anaheim. This would be the largest group we have ever taken.

## Career and Technical Education

Career and Technical Education statistics demonstrate:

75% of students who take 3 or more CTE preparatory courses go on to attend college or postsecondary education.

Of the 20 fastest growing occupation, 14 require an associate degree or less. Furthermore, of those 20 occupations with the largest numbers of new jobs projected for 2020, 18 require on-the-job training, and associate degree, or a postsecondary credential.

4 out of 5 secondary CTE graduates who pursued secondary education after high school had earned a credential or were still enrolled two years later

Healthcare occupations, many of which require an associate degree or less, make up 8 of the 20 fastest growing occupations.

CTE increases student achievement: CTE students are significantly more likely than their non-CTE counterparts to report that they developed problem-solving project completion, research, math, college, application, work-related, communication, time management, and critical thinking skills DURING high school.

The average graduation rate for students concentrating in CTE programs is 90.18%, compared to an average national freshman graduation of 74.9%.

The more students participate in CTE student organization activities, the higher their

academic motivation, academic engagement, grades, career self-efficacy, college aspirations, and employability skills.

According to the State of Washington, for every dollar spent on secondary CTE students, taxpayers will receive \$9 in return.

Students at schools with highly integrated rigorous academic and CTE programs have significantly higher achievement in reading, math, and science than do students at schools with less integrated programs.

A person with a CTE-related associate degree or credential will earn an average of at least \$4000 more per year than a person with a humanities associate degree—AND those with credentials in high-demand fields such as healthcare, can average almost \$20,000 more a year.

81 % of dropouts say that "more real-world learning" may have influenced them to stay in school.

Skilled trades are the hardest jobs to fill in the US, with recent data citing 645,000 jobs open in manufacturing alone.

A ratio of one CTE class for every two academic classes minimizes the risk of students dropping out of high school.
