Message from the Principal...

Okay, we started the week with snow flurries and we end it with the beginning of spring break! Hope you are traveling somewhere sunny. I'm not. But that is okay. Because with spring break also comes a full line of spring sports. We will have a full boat of baseball, fastpitch, soccer, and track & field next week. If you are in town, please come join us at a game or track meet. Beautiful weather guaranteed (pay no attention to that weather APP on your phone, it reports rain as a ploy to keep people from moving to the northwest).

Now for the serious stuff. This month we are posting our students who have earned an "Academic Letter." Academic letter winners must achieve and maintain a cumulative 3.7 G.P.A. This year we are awarding 212 academic letters to deserving students. In addition to our Academic Letter Awards, I would like to congratulate our TSA students that qualified for nationals this past month. See the picture of the entire team that participated on our website. I was able to attend one day of the competition and was very impressed by our students and in fact, the entire TSA State operation. There were over 1,200 students competing and CHS had 25 students place in one or more competitions. The team earned six 1st place trophies, four 2nd place trophies, six 3rd place trophies, four 4th place trophies and one 5th place trophy. Quite a haul! Several of our students will be traveling to Atlanta Georgia to compete in nationals this June.

Our FFA students took the 1st place banner from the Ferndale Veterinary Science competition, as well as 3rd place in state for Floriculture and 7th place in state for Nursery Landscape. They continue to be one of the top agriculture programs in the state and are prepping for more state competitions this spring.

Our Thespian Society participated in the State Thespian Competition this past month. There were over 1,500 students representing 75 schools. Our club was awarded the "Gold Troupe" award for Washington State,

FFA March Highlights

In March, teams and individuals from Cedarcrest FFA attended many career development competitions and events. The exceptional performance of every FFA competitor, contributed to the Cedarcrest FFA chapter's outstanding achievement in each competition.

The FFA Veterinary Science team competed at their first competition of the year in Ferndale WA, taking first place overall. The competition includes knowledge tests, an essay response written exam, animal breed,

equipment, and parasite identification, as well as hands-on clinical skills and handling practicums. Team members include, Anna Knutson, Amy Duer, Madison Rose, Brooke Downing, and Emma Chaffin. Each Cedarcrest team member earned remarkable individual scores, as they all placed within the top 16 individual placings. Anna received 1st place individually, Amy placed 5th, Madison 8th, Brooke 14th, and Emma 16th. The team will next compete at the state level competition in pursuit of upholding their first-place title.

Also included in this month's events were Cedarcrest FFA's first two state competitions of the year. FFA members competed at the state floriculture design competition and the state nursery/landscape competition. The floriculture team consisted of Sadie Lints, Taylor Ford, Kiara Bair, Leila Misallati, and Katelyn Shamon. The team won 3rd place in state, and Leila earned 8th individually. The nursery/landscape team included Sawyer Vondra, Keaton Downing, Parker Downing, and Sophia Ballard. The team took 7th place at the state competition.

On March 11th, the Cedarcrest FFA forestry career development team, competed at the South West Washington forestry competition. Team members Ella Dianich, Shad Mills, Leila Misallati, and Kire Standefer earned Cedarcrest 2nd place at the competition. The team will next compete at the upcoming state competition in April.

FFA members Anna Christensen, Ben Benson, and Megan Reid represented Cedarcrest FFA in their accomplishments at the district competition and officer election this month. Anna and Ben both competed in the public speaking events; Anna in prepared speaking, and Ben in extemporaneous speaking. Members who compete in prepared speaking, present a memorized speech on an agricultural research topic of their choice. The extemporaneous speaking competition requires participants to formulate and present a speech on an agricultural topic assigned to them shortly before presenting. Anna received 3rd place in prepared, and Ben earned 2nd in extemporaneous; both of them qualifying to compete at state level.

In the officer election portion of the district competition, Ben retired his office of district president, while Anna and Megan were elected to the 2018-2019 district officer team. Anna was elected as secretary, and Megan as president.

Washington Network for Innovative Careers (WANIC) offers courses at various high schools in area districts. These programs are open to all students entering grades 9 through 12 from Bellevue, Everett, Issaquah, Lake Washington, Mercer Island, Northshore, Riverview and Snoqualmie Valley School Districts. Tuition is free; the only cost to attend a WANIC Summer Academy class is a \$50 supply fee (assistance available for students who qualify for free or reduced lunch). Students earn .5 Occupational Education high school credits except where noted differently. Students provide their own transportation and their own lunch.

Again, classes are weekdays June 26th to July 13th and meet from 8am-3pm (no school July 4th).

Did you know that Cedarcrest has had a successful partnership with TEALS (Technology, Education, and Literacy in Schools) for several years, and that we are looking for more volunteers for next year's Computer Science classes?

TEALS is a fully funded Microsoft Philanthropies program that provides volunteer support for students in our 1st and 2nd period Computer Science classes. The role of a CHS TEALS volunteer is flexible, from as little as one day per week up to three days per week for the entire school year. You'll come in as a "Teaching Assistant", unblocking students while they work on programs and projects, and talking with and inspiring them as a professional mentor. Students will use a variety of languages (such as C++ and Java); if you have industry coding experience, you will find the coding requirements simple and be able to help each student.

What is Law Enforcement Exploring?

Law Enforcement Exploring is the preeminent career orientation and experience program for young people contemplating a career in the field of criminal justice. Its mission is to offer young adults, ages 14-21, interested in a career in law enforcement a personal awareness of the criminal justice system through training, practical experiences and other activities.

Law Enforcement Exploring is a well-established and highly respected program that has served as a platform from which countless young adults have launched a successful career with local, county, state and federal law enforcement agencies.

The mission of the Duvall Police Law Enforcement Exploring program is to bridge the gap between youth and police by educating and involving them in police operations and to interest them in Law Enforcement.

Exploring is for young men and women 14 to 21 years of age

Exploring can:

- Further each Explorer's education
- Encourage the Explorer's participation in a rewarding and productive service activity
- Enhance the Explorer's preparation for future roles as citizen and community members.

Besides gaining a working knowledge of police work, the participants have the opportunity to give of themselves to their community.

Benefits

Being an Explorer offers many opportunities to learn valuable leadership and life skills, make new friends, interact with the public. The program has helped some achieve a career in policing.

What do Explorers do?

Explorers have many opportunities to apply the training they receive during monthly meetings. For example, members volunteer at community events doing security work, directing traffic and providing overall community service.

Members can also learn first hand how Police Officers do their jobs.

What do Explorers learn?

Law enforcement posts conduct a variety of programs and projects featuring safety, training, and service. The following listing is an example of some of the activities and training in which the Explorers may participate.

- The history of law enforcement

- Note taking and study habits

Who is eligible?

You are eligible to be an Explorer if you are:

- Between 14 and 21 years of age
- You are registered as a full-time student with a grade point average of 2.5 or above
- You have not been convicted of a felony or serious misdemeanor
- You can successfully pass a minimum background check and oral interview

How do I join?

The Duvall Police Department is working in partnership with the Redmond Police Department Explorer Post, which is a well-established and exemplary Post.
