Message from the Principal...

I have been a member of this school community for 21 years as a parent, staff member and coach. Those of you that know me well, I believe understand that my first priority is to make Cedarcrest High School a safe, comfortable and fun place for students and staff. I want everyone to enjoy being here, whether you are a student here at the crack of dawn, a teacher here from morning dark to evening dark, a parent/community member coming to an athletic or cultural event or a parent helping at a PTSA activity. In my years as an educator if I have learned one thing, it is that if a student doesn't enjoy coming to school, doesn't feel safe at school, or cared for at school, they will have a difficult time *succeeding* at school. And everyone in the RSD, from our bus drivers, custodians, teachers, cooks, para-pros, administration, all the way up to our superintendent, feel the same, we want students to *succeed* in life.

In response to some unfortunate social media posts that criticized staff, students and our school community, it is timely to talk about how harassment and bullying is addressed at the high school level. First and foremost, I would like all our parents to know that at CHS we take bullying and harassing behaviors *seriously*. We train staff annually to be aware and proactive at identifying potential bullying or harassing behaviors. Further, we investigate all accusations and continue with our investigation until we have a resolution to the problem.

The process: If a student feels like they are being bullied or harassed, we encourage them to talk to their counselor or an administrator. From here, we investigate by talking to all of the parties involved, including students, staff members and parents, who may be witnesses. After we gather all the information available, we will routinely get the students together to discuss the issue. We share what we know, listen to them, and work through the problem. Our goal is not as much to discipline, although that could be a part of the resolution, but to stop the inappropriate behaviors and help students learn from them. We believe this is the only way issues get resolved to a point where students are not distracted from their school work and can learn to work together.

I would also like everyone to know that if harassment takes place off campus, where we know cyber issues abound, and the behavior results in students being distracted at school we will get involved. We are fortunate to have a member of the Duvall Police Department at school daily to help with these situations. Our School Resource Officer, Officer Clark, is very adept at talking with students and getting to the bottom of issues. He is approachable, extremely competent and enjoyable to talk with. If you are ever in the building, I am sure he would love to have a conversation.

If you ever have a question about your student being bullied, harassed or feeling uncomfortable at school, please reach out to one of my assistant principals, Mr. Ruhland or Mr. Frederick, your students' counselor or me. I have known these staff members for quite some time and am confident that we can, and will, do everything in our power to help.

Finally, I would like to say that bullying can and does happen to us all. Bullying does not only impact our students. Many adults are bullied, as well as act as a bully toward others, you see it at work, within the family, in public, while driving, and even on social media. We all can do a better job of setting an example for our students. I know I work on being a

DECA News

On January 10th, 2019 fifty (50) members of the Cedarcrest DECA chapter headed to Bellevue to compete in the Area 3 Career Development Conference at the Meydenbauer Center. Cedarcrest competed against other DECA members from Eastlake, Inglemoor, Juanita, Lake Washington, Mercer Island, Redmond and Woodinville high schools. Over 1250 competitors were in attendance competing in a series of role plays across thirty-one (31) different events.

It was a successful competition for Cedarcrest. We will be taking twenty-two (22) students to state and had multiple Area winners. The state competition will be in Bellevue from March 5-7, 2015. There will be over 3800 members across the state at this event. Those 3800 competitors had to also qualify in area competitions among the 11,000 DECA members statewide.

Our Chapter was also awarded the THRIVE Award (top level) for membership based on the chapter's membership numbers, involvement and community service. This is the 17th year in a row CHS DECA has received this recognition. Only nine chapters in our state this year received this award and less than 2% of chapters nationwide receive this honor. We also have our first ever School Based Enterprise to qualify for the International DECA conference. Congratulations to Abby McKenzie for her great work in writing and spearheading this project!!

STEM Fair

It is time for the annual Cedarcrest High School Science Fair! This year, though, there are some exciting changes. On February 23rd, we will have the first Cedarcrest High School STEM Fair. What is the difference? Science Fair had students follow the scientific method with an exact procedure, whereas STEM allows them to examine problems with real-world connections, collaboration, student voice and choice. Instead of tri-fold boards, students now generate products to demonstrate their solutions to the problem. They use science, technology, engineering and math to create their solutions. The focus won't be on competition and medals, but rather on their engaging in problem-solving and sharing their efforts with the community. Along with STEM projects, we want to demonstrate the STEM work going on in Cedarcrest classes, clubs, and organizations. AP Information

It is almost time to register for your AP Exams!

You will be registering and paying online. Visit www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/480145, or Google "Cedarcrest High School

AP Exam Registration."

Price: The fee for AP Exams is \$105.00 per exam.

Financial Aid: Qualifying low-income students can take advantage of reduced AP exam fees. The fee for qualifying students is \$15.00 per exam. Attached to this email is the Low-Income Verification Form we will need to have on file for each student seeking financial assistance. This form is also available in the CHS Counseling Office or on the OSPI website. The family must meet one of the four criteria listed on the form to qualify. There will be a question on the registration site where you can indicate your eligibility for a fee reduction. If you answer "yes", you will continue to complete your registration, but you will not submit payment until the fee reduction has been approved by the AP Coordinator. Once approved, you will receive an email from Total Registration prompting you to submit payment in the amount of \$15 per exam.

Late Registration: We will be able to accept late registrations from March 1st - 5th, however a late fee of \$10 per exam will be assessed. The Total Registration site will be closed to students beginning March 6th. If you still need to register for your exam after the site closes, please contact the AP Coordinator to make arrangements. Additional fees will be incurred. To register and purchase exams: We understand parents may desire to register their students for exams. However, we strongly recommend the student is present while registering to ensure the correct exams are ordered. To complete registration, you must answer all required questions. Registration is not complete until you reach the PDF of the confirmation page provided at the end. Please be sure to have a credit or debit card available before beginning registration.

Alternate Testing Dates: Occasionally it is necessary for students to test late. The alternate testing dates are May 22, 23, 24, depending on the subject. If you need to test on an alternate date, please contact the AP Coordinator to make arrangements. We will make every attempt to accommodate these requests, however alternate test dates are not necessarily guaranteed. There is an additional \$50 fee for all alternate exams for all reasons, except due to a medical emergency.

Here are the important dates for the AP exam registration and payment process:

- February 1, 2019 at 7:00AM - Registration opens.
- March 1, 2019 at 12:00AM - Late fee of \$10 per exam is assessed.
- March 6, 2019 at 12:00AM - Total Registration website is closed to students.
- March 8, 2019 - All payments must be received. Unpaid registrations will be cancelled, and exams will not be ordered.

Health Concerns

Measles outbreak in multiple Washington counties

OLYMPIA - The Washington State Department of Health announced today (January 24) that a King County resident with measles and several Clark County cases may have been exposed to the virus in a public location where all were present the same day and time period during their likely exposure period.

The department is supporting local public health agencies with disease investigation, laboratory testing and other efforts to protect their communities. A current statewide case count for the measles outbreak is available on the department's website and will be updated daily.

The current case count is:

- o Clark County: 25 confirmed cases, 12 suspected cases
- o King County: 1 confirmed case

[Measles is highly contagious](#) (page 86), and can be serious, especially for young children. Measles is easily spread when an infected person breathes, coughs, or sneezes. Almost everyone who has not had the vaccine will get measles if they are exposed to the measles virus.

Our school district nurses are aware of this outbreak and remaining diligent for any possible cases. At this point in time, there is NOT cause for significant concern of large exposure in our district; however, please be diligent in following our school policies for illness and keeping students at home and follow very diligent handwashing and germ spread tips below!
