#### **HIV/AIDS Education**

The AIDS Omnibus Bill, enacted by the legislature, requires that all AIDS curriculum materials used in the district be state approved. School districts must also provide AIDS education "to all students grades five through twelve once during each school year." Riverview School District is using the state approved KNOWAIDS and F.L.A.S.H. programs, developed by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction and a team of school district, university and Department of Social and Health Services personnel.

At CHS we will be asking students to view a video and power point presentation that deals with HIV and AIDS. The presentation will discuss the facts related to all aspects of contracting and treating HIV as well as current statistics. The presentation will be on Wednesday, May 24th during advisory. #### **AP Testing**

#### IMPORTANT AP EXAM INFORMATION

#### On Exam Day.....

Be sure to get a good night's rest before your exam and eat a nutritious breakfast. You are allowed to bring a snack and beverage for your 10-minute break, however food and drink are prohibited during the exam.

**ARRIVE ON TIME:** All AP Exams take place at the Riverview District Office (ESC), 15510 1st Avenue NE, Duvall. For morning exams arrive by 7:30am, for afternoon exams arrive by 11:30am. If you arrive after the exam packets have been opened, you will not be allowed to take the test and you will not get a refund.

**STUDENTS MUST PROVIDE THEIR OWN TRANSPORTATION TO THE DISTRICT OFFICE** and carpool to and from the District Office and CHS. Work out your rides and carpools now! For the afternoon exams of Physics, Computer Science and Statistics, make sure you leave CHS in time to eat your lunch and be at the District office by 11:30am.

**PARKING AT THE DISTRICT OFFICE:** Do not park in the 20 spaces directly in front of the main entrance because that's where the district office employees park. Drive through and park in the adjacent large side lot, or in the lot between the library and district office.

**EXAM COMPLETION/DISMISSAL TIMES**: Students will not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended, so do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam. This is College Board policy. If you play a sport or have a job, it is your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation and make arrangements. We anticipate morning exams will end at approximately 12pm and afternoon exams will end at approximately 4pm. These are estimates and the actual timing for exams will vary depending on subject and the number of students taking the exam.

**SCHOOL ATTENDANCE BEFORE OR AFTER EXAMS**: You are expected to attend classes when not taking exams. All students must check in at the attendance office upon returning to CHS after morning exams.

#### WHAT TO BRING TO THE EXAM:

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers for completing multiple-choice answer sheets.
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- A watch (that doesn't beep or access the internet) in case you cannot see the room clock from your seat.
- Up to two calculators if you are taking the AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Statistics, or Physics Exam(s). For more information about the calculator policy and a list of acceptable calculators, visit this website: <a href="https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/takingtheexam/exam-policies/calculator-policy">https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/takingtheexam/exam-policies/calculator-policy</a>
- A ruler or straightedge if you are taking the Physics exam. (Protractors are NOT allowed.)
- A snack and beverage for your ten-minute break.
- A sweatshirt or sweater in case the room temperature fluctuates.

#### **DO NOT BRING THE FOLLOWING TO THE EXAM:**

• Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, #3 pencils, colored pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries,

highlighters, or notes.

- Rulers, straightedges and protractors (except as previously noted for Physics.)
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Scratch Paper. (You will be able to make notes on portions of the exam booklets.)
- Watches that beep or access the internet.
- Computers or calculators (except as previously noted).
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Portable listening or recording devices (even with headphones) or photographic equipment.
- Clothing with subject-related information.
- Ear plugs.
- Clipboards.
- All electronic devices, except specific calculators noted above, including cell phones, digital cameras, personal digital assistants, smart phones, smart watches, Bluetooth-enabled devices, MP3 players, email/messaging devices, or any other electronic or communication devices.
- Phones-smart phones are not allowed in the exam room. If you bring your phone, you will be required to place it in a storage bin to be kept at the ESC front desk until your exam is concluded.

**College Board Banned Electronics Penalty:** If a student uses a cell phone or posts to any form of social media, the student's score will be cancelled, no retest will be permitted, and the student may be permanently barred from AP testing.

#### Cedarcrest FFA goes to State Horse Judging

Cedarcrest FFA traveled to Ellensburg on April 18, 2018 for the WA State FFA Horse Judging Competition, making it Cedarcrest's second year attending. Team members included Brooke Downing, Elisabeth Anderson, Taylor Ford, Sierra Owens, Ella Dianich, and Avery Jacob.

The purpose of the Horse Evaluation Career Development Event is to promote the study of and interest in equine science selection, care and well-being, management and production through the agricultural education curriculum, encourage experiential learning through use of practical skills and applied knowledge, and provide recognition for those who have demonstrated skills and competencies as a result of instruction in equine science.

When asked about the event Elisabeth Anderson, sophomore at Cedarcrest, said "it was so great to use the horse knowledge I have learned since I was little. FFA is very fun and I'm already looking forward to next year." The team did outstanding placing 4th out of 21 WA State Teams, the highest Cedarcrest has placed in horse evaluation. Avery Jacob also received a top individual award for placing 5th out of 109 participants.

#### State Forestry at Lincoln Tree Farm

April 26th, 2018 The Cedarcrest FFA Forestry team traveled to Puyallup last week for the state competition. They placed 5th out of 20 teams.

The Forestry CDE provides recognition to FFA members who demonstrate skills and competencies as a result of forestry instruction through agricultural education. The Forestry team is made up of 5 FFA members who compete in individual activities and four members who compete in a team activity. The individual activities include reforestation, timber stand improvement, timber cruising for cord volume, timber cruising for board foot volume, tree identification, ocular estimation, land measurement, hand compass practicum, forest management and tree/forest disorders. The FFA is a national organization of over 507,000 members. The FFA mission is to make a positive difference in the lives of students by developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success through agricultural education. The team consisted of Shad Mills, Kire Standefer, Ella Dianich, Leila Misallati, and Megan Reid. High Individual for the team Was Megan Reid. The Forestry Team did a very good job representing the Cedarcrest FFA in their last competition in Longview, bringing home 5th place.

The Cedarcrest High School Equestrian Team competed in its final 4-day WAHSET District meet for the season March 22-25. The small team of 9 competing athletes finished with 106 points winning the overall team points for small teams in the district!


Individually, the athletes competed in 13 out of 18 events with 40 individual rounds during the meet against large teams of over 40 members. This brought home home top 10 finishes for Cedarcrest in Dressage, Hunt Seat Equitation, Saddle Seat Equitation, Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences, and Trail Equitation. In team events, athletes placed in the top 10 in Working Pairs and Canadian Flags. There were marked improvements for all individual and team events throughout the season resulting in gold medals for the Freestyle Fours Drill team

(Piper Canning, Maddy Kniss, Avery Jacob & Megan MacLane) and silver medals for the In-Hand Obstacle Relay team (Haley Wilkes, Ariana Marquez, Maddy Kniss & Avery Jacob) which qualifies both for the State Meet May 17-20 in Moses Lake WA.

Cedarcrest has 4 individual state qualifiers including senior ARIANA MARQUEZ (Dressage, Hunt Seat Equitation, Saddle Seat Equitation), sophomore AVERY JACOB (Dressage, Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences), sophomore MADDY KNISS (Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences), and freshman LILY RICHARDSON (Hunt Seat Equitation, Reining, Showmanship, Stock Seat Equitation, Trail Equitation).

The coaches, parents, and community supporters are incredibly proud of these athletes as they continue to remind the larger schools not to underestimate this small but mighty team! This 3 year old team has 7 of its 10-member team going to State this year! GO RED WOLVES!!!
